





Spanish Artist Lorenzo Belenguer's Groundbreaking Olympic Testament Fills **London's Streets (And The Internet)**

An Olympic art installation that gives a voice to Londoners is being broadcast in major public spaces through London 2012, thanks to the support of the BBC and the GLA (General London Authority).

TESTIMONES was created by the Spanish artist Lorenzo Belenguer in response to his local community wanting to become more involved in this year's Olympic and Paralympic Games. Selected by the Olympic Committee as a top 10 project from hundreds of others, it has been adopted as one of the Cultural Olympiad's key cultural projects and is now being broadcast in collaboration with one of London's major institutions: the BBC.

This project takes raw interviews and testimonies from those who were part of the 1948 Games and are part of this year's Games, and shares these experiences in short videos. These videos will be, or have already been, broadcast in locations include the new University of the Arts at King's Cross, the Polish Cultural Centre, Willesden Green Centre and other locations.

Munira Mirza, Advisor on Culture and Youth to the Mayor of London Boris Johnson, said: 'We want as many Londoners as possible getting involved in the 2012 Games, being inspired by both the sporting action and the wide-ranging programme being planned as part of the Cultural Olympiad. TESTIMONIES is a wonderful project, connecting local people to one of the most exciting years in London's history and creating a fascinating record for long after the athletes have run and the medals have been won.'

Belenguer, who is also director of exhibitions at the Gallery Willesden Green BAR and has had his work exposed at the Tate Modern, explains that "this project's driving aim is to connect local people with one of the most exciting years in the history of London and

create a dynamic conversation around the Games. The main question for us is: What kind of relationship do Londoners have with the Olympics? And we want this conversation to fill London's streets and the internet via Social Media."

Jonathan Edwards, Deputy Chair of the London 2012 Nations and Regions group said: 'The Inspire programme is an Olympic and Paralympic first and projects like TESTIMONIES will go down in the history books as one of the fantastic projects that used the power of the 2012 Games to inspire a generation.'

TESTIMONES can also be found in Willesden Green, the Polish Cultural Centre, Waltham Forest and in central Soho, amongst other locations. It has also created a diverse web presence and everybody is welcome to make contributions via social networks such as Facebook, Twitter and Vimeo.

His work straddles the realms of sculpture, painting and drawing. Currently the Spaniard is working on a project for the 'Culture Olympiad for London 2012'. An economics graduate prior to changing career path, Belenguer lived and worked in Paris before arriving in London where his art has developed further. He has mounted and participated in of exhibitions in unorthodox spaces over the years.
